Mission: Believes in the inherent worth of every homeless man, woman and child. Our programs provide the rehabilitation and discipleship that allow us to achieve this mission, leading to positive, lasting change – and creating better lives for those we serve, their families.

They go to the streets of Ocean Beach several times a month with backpacks of supplies and home-cooked meals. Working to fill in with Transitional Youth and our current mission: To end youth homelessness by providing supportive housing and job training to cultivate personal responsibility.

We operate an emergency overnight shelter for 20-25 homeless youth.

Purpose: Provide food, water, socks, hygiene kits, sometimes clothing, shoes and during cold months blankets and sleeping bags.

Burrito Boyz/Kids Korner

Mission: The Burrito Boyz/Kids Korner mission is to help nourish the spirit of Street Homeless youth of San Diego County by providing Hot Food & Comfort. Every Sunday volunteers meet at Long Island Mike's Pizza Kitchen to make over 600 breakfast burritos for this purpose.

Purpose: Our needs are to supply San Diego Homeless Kids with a special pack filled with 2 fresh fruits, 3 snacks, and a juice box. Every Sunday we fill 30 to 40 bags. baby wipes, sun block, beanies, mittens, diapers, back to school items etc.

Mission: The mission of the Community Christian Service Agency, an ecumenical Christian agency, is to provide emergency services to individuals and families in

need in San Diego County, including food, clothing, and referrals, and where practical, counseling to assist in their transition to self-reliance. The agency is supported by its member churches, hundreds of individual donors, businesses, small grants, and various fundraising efforts.

Monarch School

Mission: Monarch has served San Diego for nearly three decades, beginning as a one-room education center and expanding into a K-12 comprehensive school designed to educate homeless youth. At Monarch, we give students the skills and tools they need to overcome these odds. Sandra McBayer founded the school in 1987 recognizing the need to get homeless youth off the streets and in school. She was later named Teacher of the Year by President Bill Clinton for her work. In 1999, the Monarch School Project a 501 (c)(3) was established by San Diego Rotary to help relocate the school to a new facility. Today, the partnership between the school and the non-profit continues to make Monarch a recognized leader in the education of homeless youth.

Purpose: Purchase shoes and sweatshirts for students.
