Members in "The Spotlight"

JEAN and GENE BAUER

Many years ago, 1957 to be exact, Art Linkletter wrote a book entitled "Kids Say The Darnest Things." Such sayings as, "Give Monny a lot of real sweet food so she'll get fat--that's how you get a baby," were reiterated in the book. Gene and Jean Bauer have not only heard many of those darnest things spewed by kids, but both of them have also seen many of the darnest things kids have done.

Gene and Jean Bauer were elementary school teachers for a combined 46 years. Gene taught for 35 years, and Jean for 21 years. And with both of them, FOCUS is all about the kids. They have served FOCUS for so many years because it gives them the opportunity to directly support kids.

Not just put money in an envelope, and send it to a charitable organization, but it allows them to actually visit the many agencies that support youngsters, and see, and experience the fruits of their labor.

Jean gets a little choked up when she sees the St. Jude's Hospital ad on television with all the little kids.

They have raised money for kids. They have put together backpacks for kids, as well as delivered these backpacks to agencies which distributed them to youngsters. Jean described it this way, "We started off like the Brady Bunch, and kids have always been in our lives."

And she was absolutely right. When they got married in 1973 Gene, a widower, had four youngsters, two boys and two girls, while Jean, a single mom, had a boy and a girl of her own. They were both teaching at an elementary school in Fullerton, California when they met. They dated, and eventualy got married. Their large house consisted of six bedrooms, and four bathrooms, and was as hectic as one can imagine. Teaching school, making lunches, driving to and from sporting practices and events, buying food, cooking food, buying clothes and mending clothes, were just a few of what needed to be done.

"When Julie, the youngest, was about 5 or 6," Jean recalled, "I always made them make their beds everyday before anything else was started. One day Julie was pulling a mattress down the stairs, and I stopped her, and asked what she was doing. She said she was tired of making her bed and was getting rid of the mattress."

Jean Lunenschloss was born in Richland Center, Wisconsin. Her dad, a dairy farmer, had nine brothers and sisters. Jean has one sister who resides in Phoenix, Arizona. The family moved to Arizona when Jean was still a youngster. She attended Catholic grade school, and then an all girls Catholic high school. She graduated from Arizona State University (ASU) and moved to the Los Angeles area to begin her teaching career.

Gene was born, and raised in Hamilton, Ohio, located 20 miles north of Cincinnati. He attended Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. It was the first university chartered by an act of Congress (1804), and opened its doors to students in 1809. Gene was in the ROTC and served two years in the army after his degree in Elementary Education. After leaving the army he too moved to Los Angeles.

Both Gene and Jean have their master's degree in Education Administration.

It was in 1989 when the couple moved to the Coronado Cays. Their realtor, Dawn Ross, was a FOCUS member, and encouraged Jean to join, which she did. Gene did not become a member until men were accepted in 2009. They both have been active throughout the years, helping where needed, and when needed.

Gene recalled a time when an agency for boys needed a basketball hoop installed at the agency's facility. The task entailed a hole being dug for the pole, cement poured, and a basket hoop attached to the pole, and then the pole with the hoop heisted into position. He then realized that the net had to be secured to the hoop, which meant another trip, on another day, with a ladder, to hook the net unto the loop.

Gene has served as a Boy Scout troop leader for two of his boys while they were growing up, and whom eventually advanced to the rank of eagle scout. One of the boy's eagle scout project was to raise money, and obtain a seeing eye dog for a young man who was vision impaired. Girl Scouts also was the calling of a couple of the Bauer girls as well, and Girl Scout cookies can still be found in the Bauer's house. With seven grandchildren it is almost inevitable

And it may be the first, but the Bauers now have a granddaughter living in Carlsbad who is also a FOCUS member. Danni Fredricks, the granddaughter, also believes FOCUS, and kids go hand in hand.

The Bauers have traveled all over the world. They are not the type to join a tour group, and on one adventure, rented a car in Amsterdam for six weeks, and toured a good portion of Europe. With no given agenda, they traveled many a road, and at the end of the day, never failed to find lodging for the night.

They are both avid readers. Gene reads both fiction and non-fiction. Jean enjoys a good mystery. During the pandemic they have put together many jigsaw puzzles. Jean is an excellent interior designer and has never taken any classes in design. Their home could easily be an inspiration to many want-to-be designers. Their master shower has no doors, one main entrance, and no raised barrier to step over-- a tribute to their talents..

With six kids, and 47 years of marriage, the Bauers still strongly support FOCUS, and have enjoyed seeing the many benefits derived from their efforts, and encourage all FOCUS members to remember, "It is all about the kids."
