



### Pat Robitaille, President



# Fundraising Sharyn Blongiewicz





# Member in the Spotlight Marianna Polles

Greek movies that can be easily recalled include Zorba the Greek with Anthony Quinn released in 1964. Never on a Sunday with Jules Dassin, and Melina Mercount as the happy prostitute which appeared on the big screen in 1960. And lastly there was Mama Mia filmed on Skopelos Island, off-shore of the mainland, with Meryl Streep. This film debuted in 2008.

Did you ever hear of the Greek model names Marianna Thedorakos? She was a runway model, which meant she walked up and down the runways modeling newly fashioned clothes. She not only modeled clothes, but also jewelry. For 25 years this Greek lady modeled in the United States. This still beautiful lady, is a long time FOCUS member. One of the original FOCUS members from the early eighties, you know her as Marianna Polles.

She was born in a little Greek town named Krokeai, which is near Sparta, Greece. While she was growing up there the population was a couple hundred residents. It now has a population of 1,329 residents. The town is about 99 miles Southwest of Athens, and is considered a suburb of Sparta.

King Leonidas ruled the city of Sparta. It was he who led an army of Greeks along with 300 Spartans in 480 B.C. to defend the passage of Persians going through Thermophyiae, a narrow canyon. This epic battle was made into another movie entitled 300, The Rise of An Empire released in 2014. Interesting how they have kept their history dating as far back as 480 B.C.

The young and beautiful Marianna left Greece when she was still a youngster. Her brother Peter came with the famly, and settled in La Porte, Indiana. They resided there for a few years, and then the clan migrated to Pensacola, Florida. While in Indiana however, Marianna's Aunt, Penelope, decided to Americanize Marianna. She cut her beautiful long hair, and changed her name to Mary Ann, thinking that by doing so would allow her to fit in better with Americans society. It was not until later in life did Mary Ann change her name back to Marianna, which she did with enthusiasm..

While in Florida, and having graduated from high school, Marianna met John Polles. John was a dentist who hadhis practice in Jackson, Mississippi. John came to Pensacola to meet and marry another Greek girl that had been arranged by the girl's parents. Of course when John Polles saw the beautiful Marianna Thedorakos he decided to marry her instead, and not the girl that he was there to meet and marry.

The engagement of Marianna to John Polles did not sit well with the Polles family, after all Marianna lived on the Greece mainland and John's family was from the island of Dkopelos. While they were both Greek, and faithful members of the Greek Orthodox church, they were not alike according to the Polles family. Their dialect was different, and their way of life was perceived as different. However, once the Polles family got to know the lovely Marianna, all was forgiven, and she was warmly received by all.

Marianna and John had four children, three girls and one boy. Their children have given Marianna 6 grandchildren. John Polles passed away at an early age, after finally leaving his dental practice and moving to Chula Vista, California where Marianna's brother resided..

Marianna has done so much for so many organizations. While in Mississipppi she was president of the South Jackson Civic League, on the Board of Directors of the Jackson Ballet Company, and a Girl Scout leader for 17 years. All this while still modeling. When arriving in California she quickly became a board member of the California Ballet Company.

She has been active with the Spyridon, Greek Orthodox church of San Diego for over 16 years. A Sunday school teacher, board member, and treasurer of the Greek orthodox ladies philoptochos society. She has also helped with the annual Greek festival at the church for many years. Do attend one if you never have been to a joyous Greek festival.

After the passing of John Polles, Marianna eventually met, and married Tom Horning, a successful Chula Vista business entrepreneur. Tom was president of the People's Bank of Chula Vista, owned an insurance agency, and being an avid motorcycle rider, in 1985 purchased the Harley-Davidson dealership in Chula Vista, which was eventually moved to National City, California. He passed away in 2008, but Marianna along with her daughters continued to run the dealership with 42 employees until 2019, when she finally sold the business.

Marianna, a licensed realtor, rented a house at The Point in the Cays in the early eighties. While living there in 1982, she met **Shelby Skinner**, and **Bonnie Wainwright** of FOCUS, which she joined, and has been a member ever since,. She was president in 2011 and 2012, and again president in 2018. And for those of us that remember, a FOCUS membership meeting was held at the Harley-Davidson dealership in National City.

Marianna has played the piano since she was 9 years old, and still plays today. As a past Captain of the C-Gulls of the Coronado Cays Yacht Club, she still plays bridge every week at the yacht club, and helps with the boating regattas. And when Charles and Linda Hayes of FOCUS went to visit Greece, their tour guide was Marianna. Rudy and Marie Dew also of the Cays were included in the entourage.

She once taught a Greek cooking class, and offered to teach one again. For \$50 this writer would sign up, with all proceeds going to FOCUS, and it would include recipes. How many other FOCUS members would be willing to sign up? Marianna still has a 1980's FOCUS bulletin in her collection of FOCUS items.

Keeping up with Marianna is a difficult challenge. She is not afraid to tackle any project, and will easily get you involved.

Thanks Marianna for all that you do for FOCUS. You are an inspiration, and a true FOCUS enthusiast, and mentor, for all to appreciate. **The spotlight is on you!**
