

Member Spotlight by Don Swanson

This being the 40th year of the founding of FOCUS, with the ruby being the stone enshrouded in traditional symbolism as the gemstone commemorating the 40th anniversary, I thought it be appropriate to write about the ruby as a gemstone. This decision came about after discussing rubies with Lisa Alves, esteemed FOCUS member who is handling the acquisition of donated rubies for the auction at our Gala Event.

What you probably do not know is that ruby is a species of the corundum family. Ruby is red, and all other colors are sapphire. Simple enough, and now we know that all sapphires are not blue. Yes, a sapphire can be clear and not exhibit a color, or a tint of color. It can be green, blue, yellow (often referred to as golden), or any color except red.

Corundum is hard, it is nine on the hardness scale, with diamond being 10. Common glass is about 5 1/2. Commercial grinding wheels and those found in home garages are made of corundum. It has a specific gravity of 3.95 to 4.05 which is the difference between the weight of the stone in air, divided by the weight of the stone in air minus the weight in water.

Of the six crystal systems, corundum belongs in the hexagonal system, which means a perfect corundum crystal will have six sides. Diamonds are in the cubic system, where a perfect crystal will exhibit four sides, like a cube of sugar. However, you will rarely find a perfect ruby crystal. The majority of rough rubies are contaminated by a mixture of intrusive elements, and/or the change in heat or pressure during the growth cycle. The chemical composition of corundum is aluminum oxide Al2 O3. The color is caused by chromium oxide in the red (ruby), titanium and iron oxide in the blue (sapphire) iron oxice in the yellow (golden sapphire), chromium and iron oxide in the orange sapphire, and chromium, titanium.and iron oxide in the purple sapphire.

There are a lot of other technical data that pertains to corundum, such as optical characteristics like refractive index, birefringence, optic character, and pleochroism. These features enable gemologists to identify an unknown gemstone given to them to identify. There is a true synthetic corundum with all the proper attributes of a natural stone. In the early 1900's synthetic rubies and sapphires were made in France, Germany, and Switzerland. Around 1947 the American Linde Air Products Company began production of synthetic corundum stones in the United States. A trained gemologist can identify a synthetic stone

by spherical gas bubbles seen under a microscope inside the stone, and by inclusions seen under microscope in natural stones.

Rubies and sapphires can be opaque, translucent, or transparent. They can also exhibit an asterism, or a six legged star. Orientation of the star is determined by a lapidary cutter, who must center the asterism at the top of the dome of the stone being cut to properly display the star.


When buying a ruby or a sapphire, first determine the usage. Do you want it in a ring, pendent, or other media? Once you determine the size or shape, personal preferences come into play. The shade of color, whether it be opaque, translucent or transparent, synthetic, or exhibit a star is to be considered by the buyer. Also to be answered, is whether the stone of your choosing is a cabochon or a faceted stone. Cabochons are dome shaped, and flat on the bottom, while faceted stones are cut with many facets. like a cut diamond, Synthetic stones of course are usually cheaper to buy than natural stones, however they do still retain the natural characteristics and are flawless. Natural stones can contain flaws such as visible inclusions, but which is really not important because you are usually buying a ruby or sapphire for color and not pureness.

It takes about an hour or two hours to cut a cabochon, and twice that time, four hours, to facet a gemstone. Because of the hardness of corundum, cutters generally use diamond impregnated laps.

The majority of all school class rings, and military branch rings are made with synthetic corundum, both ruby and blue sapphire.
